# EASY MOVING CHECKLIST

Follow this checklist to ensure a smooth, stress-free move, as you transition into your new space.



#### **3-6 MONTHS BEFORE MOVING**

I	. <u>Find a new place</u>
	Renting or Buying - time can differ depending on your need, so make sure you start looking for your new place early.
	Contact your current landlord or your rental management agency, in advance, and give them your timeline.
2.	Estimate the size of your move Go through every room and decide what you want to take with you, what you leave behind, donate or throw away.
	Make an inventory of all items.
	Address sentimental items with special care. Write down the items.
3.	Decision on Moving Approach Weigh the pros and cons of self-move versus professional movers.
	Evaluate the complexity, size and distance of your move and decide accordingly.

### 2 MONTHS BEFORE MOVING

	1. Pick a moving company Research and compile a list of moving companies
	Check online reviews and ask for recommendations.
	Gather quotes and estimates
	Think of questions to ask the movers
	Notify the company of your moving date

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	Start packing Start packing non-essential items, such as books, home decor, and electronics.
	Sell, donate, or discard unwanted belongings
2.	Visit your new place Measure the door size and check if your furniture can get through
	Visit the neighborhood and find the nearest shops, gas stations, bus stations, and parks.
	Assess furniture needs at the new location.
	If you have pets, check every door and window to ensure they latch properly.
3.	Arrange utilities at the new place If moving to or within The Netherlands, you can use a service that connects you to all utility providers, stress-free. One example is easynuts.nl
4.	Cleaning Decide how you will manage cleaning of the old place. Rental agencies may keep the deposit if the place isn't properly cleaned
	Decide how you will manage the cleaning of the new place
	Book a professional cleaning with a specialized company. <b>ICC</b> is one example – it provides cleaning after moving and cleaning for the new place. Arrange the dates when they can come for cleaning.

1. Maintenance and Repair     Complete any necessary repairs or     maintenance at the old place
Check if any necessary repairs need to be done at the new place
2. <u>Start packing</u> Pack the things that you use infrequently.
Create a labeling system for efficient unpacking, such as room names or numbers
Put stickers on the boxes, specifying the desired location where they should be placed
Put stickers on the items that will be thrown away or donated
Put stickers on the fragile items

1	. <u>Pack essentials</u>
	Start packing clothes and label them accordingly
	Use wrapping paper or bubble wrap for fragile kitchen items and specify their location
	Have rugs and curtains cleaned and wrap them
	Pack important items, such as electronics, jewelry, and documents
	If using a moving company, arrange with the movers how packing should be done
	Prenare for the move
	2. <u>Prepare for the move</u> Get days off from work if you need to
	Confirm again with the moving company and the cleaning company about the dates of the move
	Make sure there is a free parking spot right in front of the old place and the new place for the moving company.
	Inspect the old place with the landlord or property management agent

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# THE WEEK BEFORE THE MOVE

- 1	. <u>Prepare an overnight essentials kit</u>
	Towels Toothbrushes and toothpaste Essential kitchen appliances (coffee maker, sandwich maker) Toilet paper Cups/Plates/Forks Bed Sheets/Pillows Soap and Dish Soap Pet Food Scissors Phone Chargers Snacks/Coffee
	2. <u>Pack your suitcases</u>
	Clothes for the first few days
	Medicine
	All other essentials
	3. <u>Before the move</u> Make sure to empty, clean, and defrost the freezer at least 24 hours before moving day.
	Announce your neighbors about the move
	Recheck if all boxes are taped shut and labeled
	Record a 10-20 minute video (open all the drawers, cabinets, closets, etc) so you know how things are supposed to be when you unpack in the new place
	Check furniture for dents and scratches

# THE MOVING DAY

Ensure that everything is prepared and packed before the moving company arrives
If you are moving on your own, decide which items you want to be loaded last, they will be the first to be unloaded in your new home. Your overnight essentials box should be loaded last.
The path in front of the place must be clear
If you have pets, you can leave them in a room where there are no things to move
Do not use the washing machine or the dryer on the day of the move
If you're using a moving company, welcome the movers, discuss how the day will go and where you are needed, and let them do their work
If you move on your own, start loading everything
Have water bottles available
Supervise movers and coordinate the moving process.
Conduct a final walkthrough of the old home to ensure nothing is left behind.
Don't forget to lock the house and take the keys, before leaving.
Arrive at the new home to oversee unloading and placement of belongings.

	Verify the status of utility services.
	Inspect your new home
	Address immediate concerns.
	Unpack necessary items for daily living.
	Arrange furniture and install appliances.
T	HE FIRST WEEK AFTER THE MOVE
	Register with local healthcare providers.
	Change locks for enhanced security. Even if you think you can trust the previous owners, you never know to whom they gave a copy of the key
	Unpack: Proceed with unpacking everything, starting with essentials. Then go room by room until you finish unpacking the rest of the house.
	Cleaning: Now it's a good time to give the new place a thorough cleaning. You might want to do the same for the previous place. Arranging this with a professional cleaning company should be a breeze.
	Explore the neighborhood
	Check the collection dates for garbage
	Register your pet with the municipality
	Hand over keys to the old place to the landlord

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#### THE FIRST MONTH AFTER THE MOVE

Arrange furniture and decorate to make the space feel like a home
Deal with problems such as repairs or maintenance.
Connect with neighbors
Dispose of or recycle packing materials
Declutter and organize the new space
Enroll children in local schools
Discover nearby grocery stores, ATMs, and shops.
Familiarize yourself with local public transportation.
